## Grab & Go Meal Program

When the COVID-19 pandemic caused the Clubs to shut down, the Club still wanted to help families.

The Club partnered with The Lighthouse to serve Grab & Go meals at three locations for youth in the community. The Club still serves Grab & Go meals Monday through Friday at its Menifee, Perris, and Quail Valley locations. All meals include milk, a breakfast snack, fruit, and a dinner meal. During regular Club operations, members receive this snack and dinner during the after-school program.

## **Program Highlight**

### **Music Lessons Go Virtual**



The Boys & Girls Clubs of Inland Valley is blessed to have wonderful instructors from the community who come to the Club and teach kids a variety of enrichment activities whether it's Taekwondo, acrylic paint, dance, etc. When the Club's shut down, the music teacher Miss Melissa wanted to find a way to still teach kids and quickly pivoted to virtual music lessons.

Miss Melissa said, "While schools struggled to find a way to continue education, those of us who were teaching our children in the classroom, were plunged into a bit of chaos, not knowing if all of the progress the kids had achieved would be lost .Thankfully, we live in a digital age, with technology able to provide online distance learning. As a music teacher at the Menifee Clubhouse, we were able to transition the music students from live lessons to virtual lessons."

Miss Melissa was able to stay connected with her students and provide a sense of normalcy during an uncertain time and has continued to do so during the shutdown.

"The parents were amazing", said Miss Melissa. "They were quick to set up with virtual lessons, so we were able to get back to lessons without skipping a beat. Being able to continue teaching online not only gave the students an opportunity to have consistency with weekly lessons, something extremely important when learning something as complex as music, but pushed them into being more reliant and independent on where to find notes, key and strings on their various instruments. Many parents enjoy the online lesson experience, and actually have been able to be more interactive during the student's lessons. Some remark how they too have been learning along with their child. It's such a wonderful option to be able to continue with lessons, especially in such an unusual and challenging time."

The Club plans to continue virtual lessons until it can reopen and is using this as an opportunity to serve kids in a new way.
